Echidna

The echidna is a highly adaptable creature that can be found throughout Australia. They are found in coastal forests, alpine meadows and deserts. The echidna has the widest distribution of any native Australian mammal.



The echidna has a skinny snout and a long flicking tongue which is perfect for catching insects. It also has very sharp spines, known as quills, along its back and sides.

When an echidna is threatened, it will curl inwards leaving only its quills exposed. This is a form of protection from predators. Termites and ants are what echidnas love to eat.


They especially love eating beetle larvae which are a type of soil invertebrate. Their sharp claws are what help them to find termites, as they often hide in rotting logs.























Putting Together a Flower

The Echidna Life Cycle

The echidna is an egglaying mammal or monotreme. The female lays one soft-shelled egg at a time, into her pouch.



The echidna leaves the burrow once it is about 6 months old. When it becomes an adult echidna, it finds a mate and reproduces.

The egg hatches after about 10 days. The young echidna is blind, hairless and about the size of a jelly bean. It holds onto hairs inside the mother's pouch, and drinks milk for 2-3 months.



When it grows spines and becomes too prickly, the mother removes it from her pouch and builds a burrow for it. It keeps drinking milk for the next 6 months.


The echidna secretes milk through its skin as it doesn't have any nipples.

A baby echidna is called a puggle.


