Koalas



Koalas are mammals and belong to the marsupial family. They live in eucalypt forests around Eastern Australia. They are active at night and sleep during the day. A koala will sleep for around 18 – 20 hours per day!

Koalas are **herbivorous** animals and only eat gum leaves (eucalypt leaves).

A koala has thick woolly fur to help protect it from the elements. Its fur can either be a grey or brownish colour. Koalas have 4 strong limbs to support their weight when climbing. Each paw has two thumbs on it, sharp claws and rough pads to help it grip onto tree trunks and branches. An adult koala will grow to be around 60cm in height.

A female koala has a pouch for its baby. Baby koalas are called 'joeys'. A joey will stay in its mother's pouch for about 7 months after it is born. There, it will drink milk, develop and stay safe from **predators**.

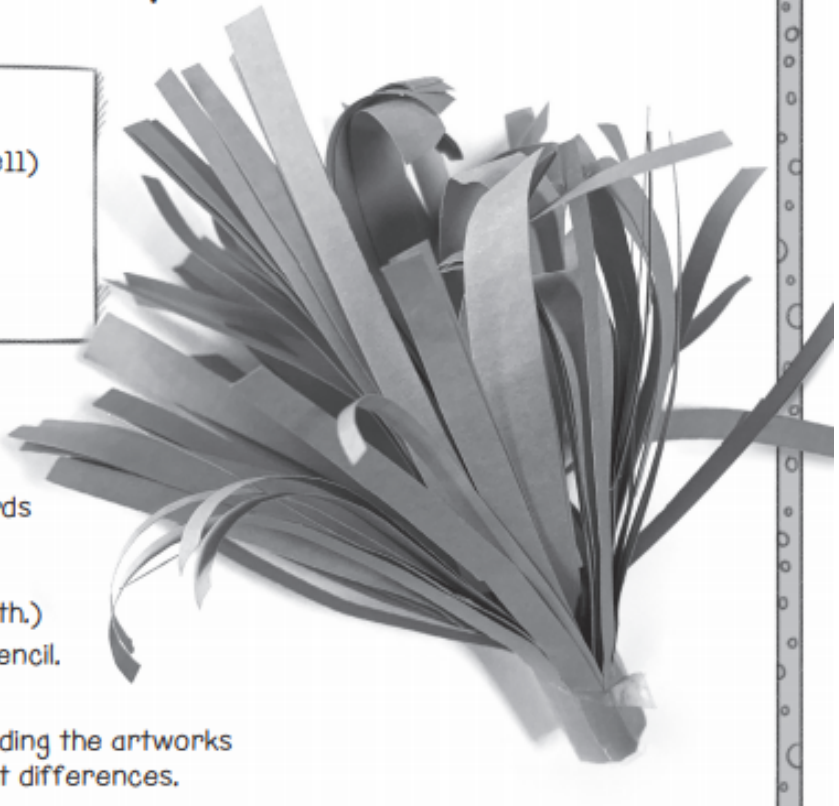
Make a Sea Anemone From Paper

Materials

- Colourful A4 paper (fluoro colours work well)
- Scissors
- Pencil/dowel stick
- Tape
- Plasticine/playdough

Instructions

- ▶ Fold paper in half, long side.
- ▶ Using scissors cut into fine strips 3/4 of the way towards the closed base. (The double thickness will give the paper more strength.)
- ▶ Roll the paper around the pencil.
- ▶ Fasten the roll with tape.
- ▶ Create a class display by adding the artworks to plasticine to create height differences.



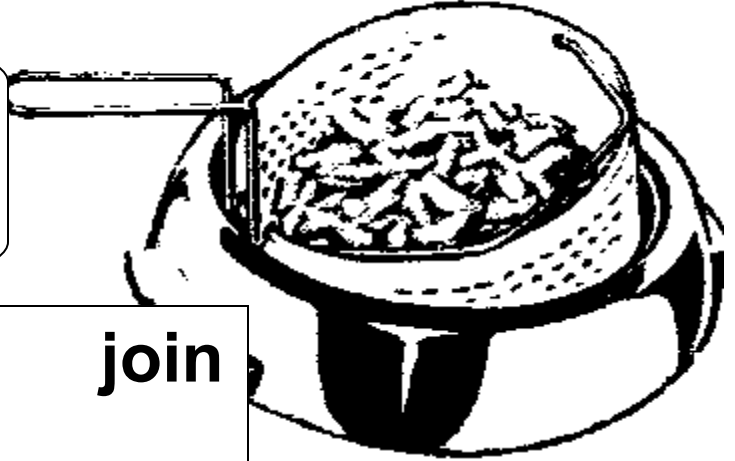

Make a Quadrilateral Mobile

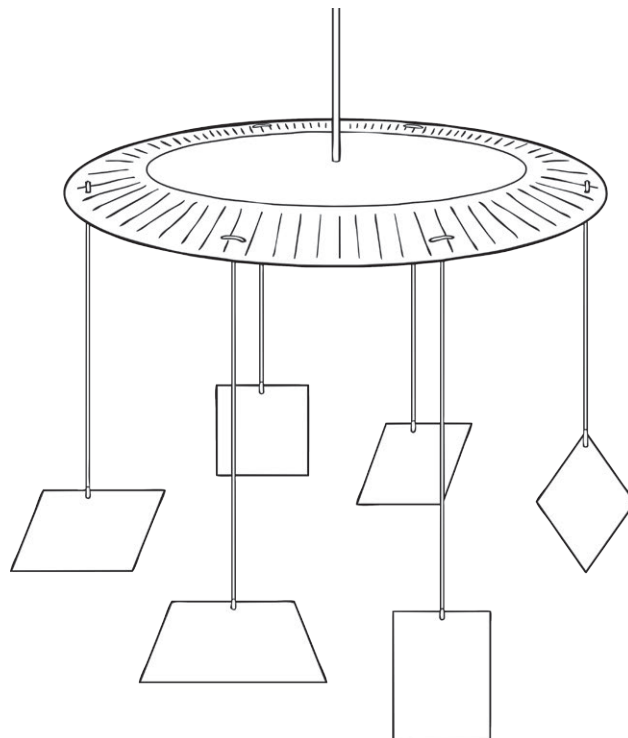
You Will Need:

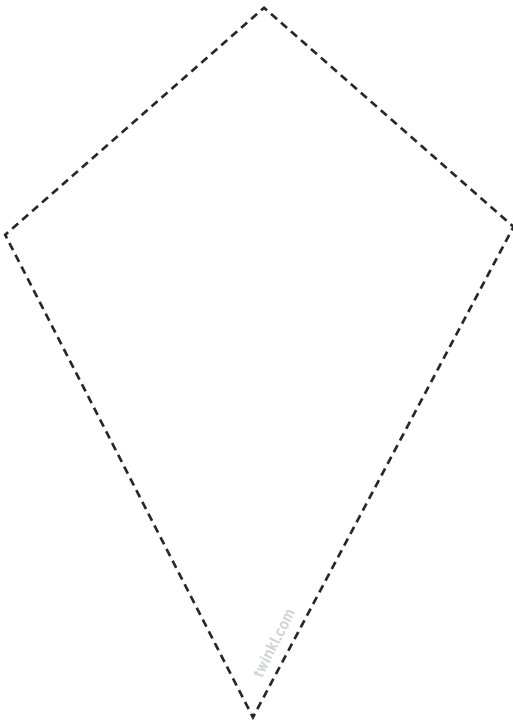
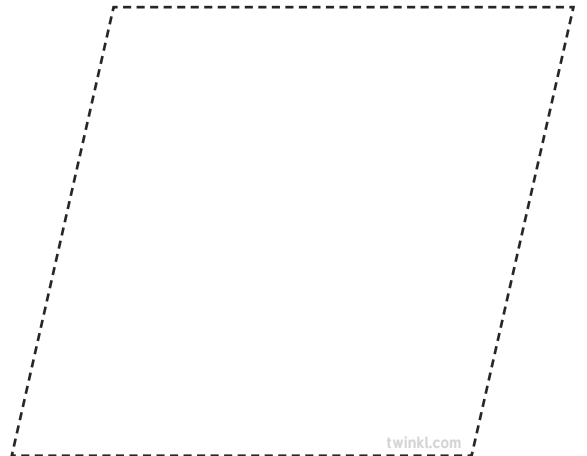
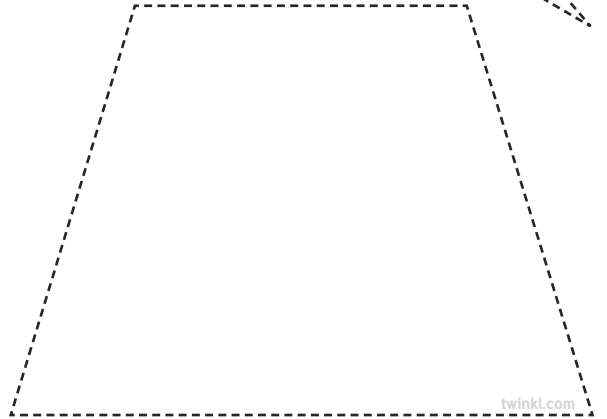
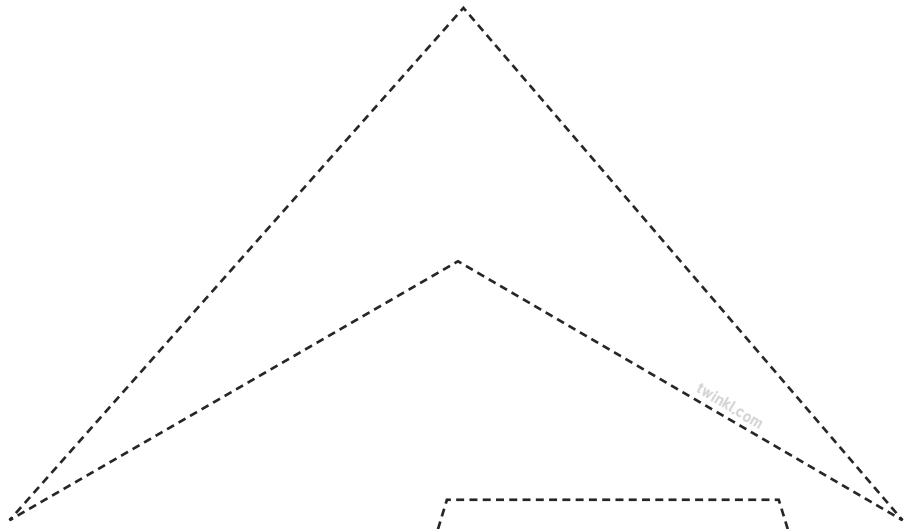
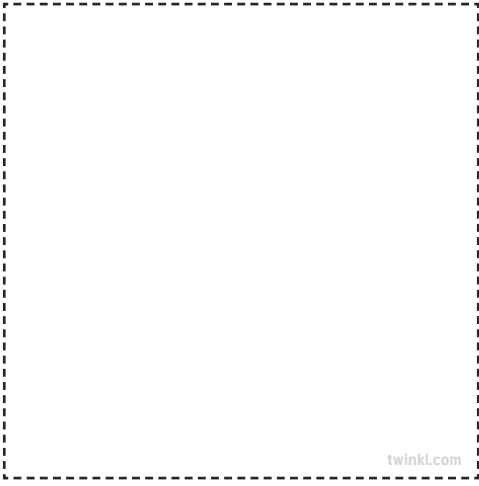
- Printed quadrilaterals
- A paper plate
- A pencil and modelling clay
- Sticky tape
- String, cut into 8 lengths of about 6 inches each

Instructions

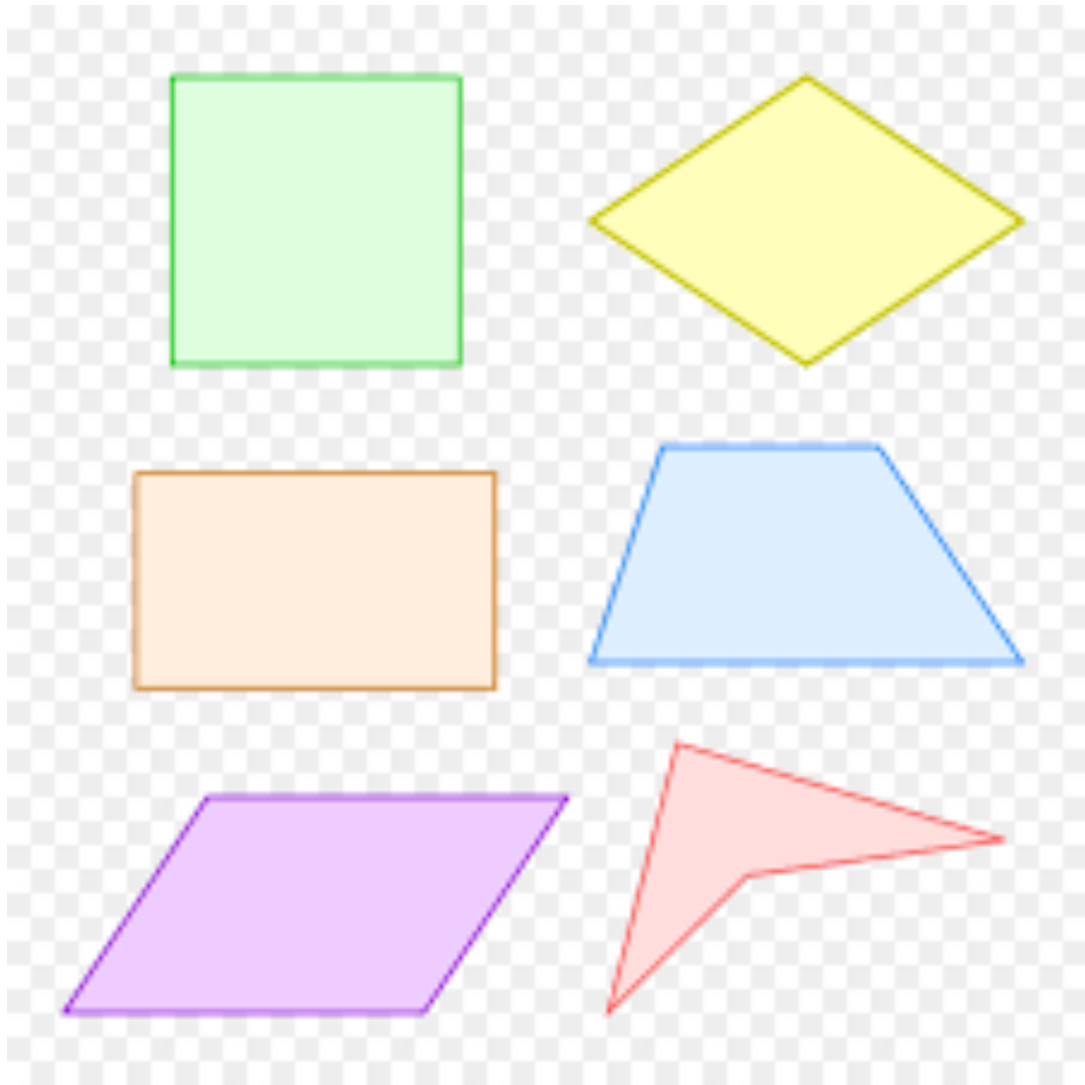
1. Cut out your printed shapes.
2. Using the pencil and modelling clay, make a small hole in the centre of your paper plate.
3. Next, make 7 more holes around the edge of your plate using the pencil and the modelling clay.
4. Tie a knot in the end of a piece of string and push it through the hole in the centre of the plate. This will hang your mobile from the ceiling.
5. Tie knots in 7 more pieces of string and push them through from the top of your mobile.
6. Tape your shapes onto the ends of the string.

Tip: Decorate your paper plate with pictures of your favourite shapes!

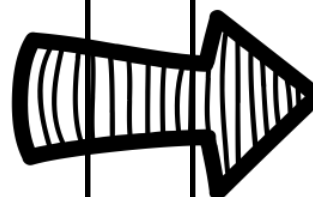
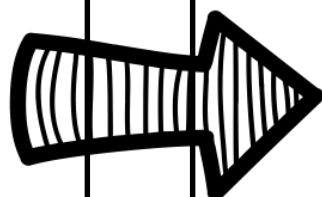

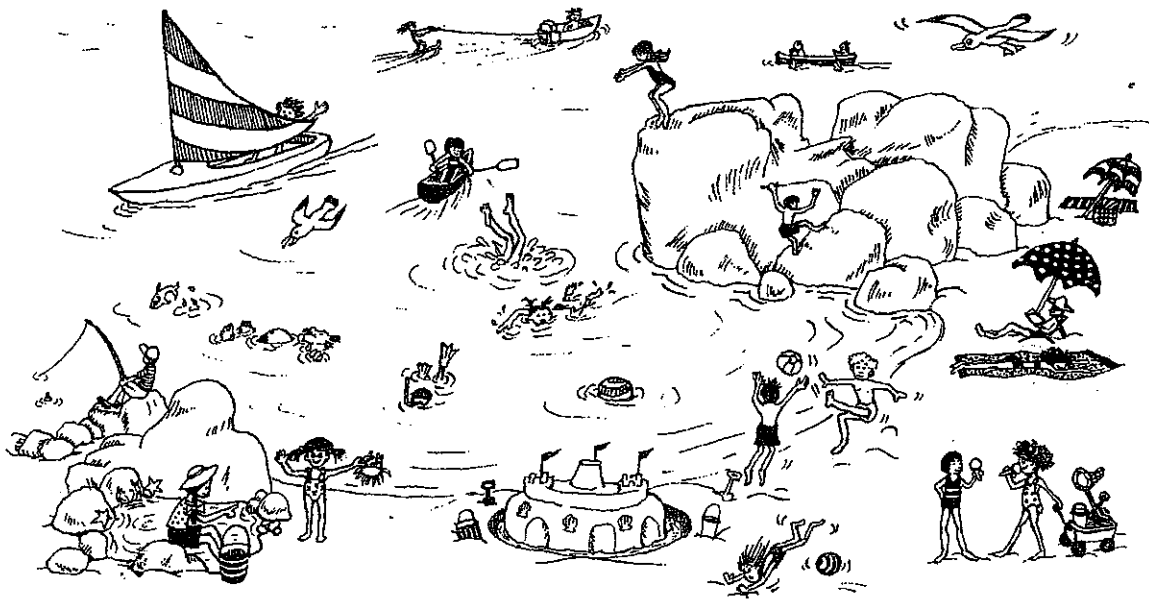
